Mărțișor (mər'tsi'for) is a celebration at the beginning of spring, on March the 1st in Romania, Moldova, and all territories inhabited by Romanians and Moldovans. The word Mărțișor is the diminutive of Mart, the old folk name for March (martie, in modern Romanian), and thus literally means "little March". Mărțișor, marț and mărțișuș are all names for the red and white string with hanging tassel customarily given on the 1st day of March.

Martisor is an over 8000 years old tradition, born in the lands where now Romania is.
